Spring and summer tours 2009:

Families/Individuals: Contact us to see how we can blend your family with an existing group tour if possible. We are not able to keep specific open hours, but if you call ahead, often we can accommodate your family while our family is working on the farm. We are open from mid-April to late July. We are closed on Sundays.

Scheduled Group tours require about 1 ½ to 2 hours for the guided part of the tour, depending on the size of the group. Plan for extra time to play and enjoy the picnic area. Discuss with us when you call about eating lunch before or after your tour.

Tour Prices: \$6.00 per student. \$3.00 per adult chaperone. (For adult groups who tour—the price is \$6.00 per adult.) Children under 2 are free. For school groups, teachers and classroom aides are free.

TOURS INCLUDE:

Story time: We will talk about the food we grow to make a taco and the good food choices we can find in the garden. We'll also look for other lessons on the farm that remind us to make positive choices in our lives.

TEACHERS: We are teaching across the curriculum: KY core content subjects & TN Standards that likely will be covered are: *AE 5.1 & 5.4, PL-P-PW-S-PPH6, PL-EP-1.1.6 (Making healthy and wise choices); AE 2.3, SC-P-UD-S-1, SC-EP-3.4.1 (Basic needs of plants and animals); SC-P-UD-S-4, SC-EP-3.4.3 (Identifying plants in KY), SC-P-UD-S-6, SC-EP-3.4.4 (Life cycles); AE 2.8, MA-U-P-M-3, MA-P-NPO-S-E1, MA-EP-1.2.1 (Estimations), MA-P-M-U-2, MP-P-M-S-MPA1, MA-EP-2.1.3 (Measurements); AE 2.18, SS-P-E-U-6, SS-P-E-S-4, SS-EP-3.4.3 (Role of farmers in food production).*

Planting: *Spring:* We will take you into the garden and let you help us plant seeds or plants according to the garden schedule. *Summer:* We will go to the garden and either plant a late crop or begin harvesting the crops.

Feed and pet the animals: Travel around the farm on our **tractor wagon ride** as we visit our animals at another barn. We will provide grain for the animals to eat and often times a bottle to feed to a baby calf.

Plant your own seeds: We will help each person plant seeds (usually pumpkin or sunflower seeds) in a small container to grow in their backyard. Each visitor will receive a ruler to measure the growth of the plant and the depth to plant the container at home.

Playtime: No trip to the farm is complete without playtime. Old farm trucks have been renovated for our **Graintruck playground** and will be available for children to play in like a giant sandbox. (Remember to remove shoes so you don't carry your shoes full of corn when you leave!) The **tricycle track** will be available as well as an **expanded swing-set** and **slide** area. Play areas include **Frisbees and Frisbee golf target** and **balls**.

Picnic areas are available for your use. Visitors need to bring their lunch, but we have water and lemonade available for our guests at no charge. Canned sodas, bottled water, and packaged snacks are available for purchase. **Restroom** facilities are available.
